Ms. Annick Goulet was appointed Permanent Representative of Canada on the ICAO Council on 3 July 2023.

Ms. Goulet joined the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade in 1999, after having worked as a journalist in Canada, Europe and Asia. Prior to her most recent appointment as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Romania, Bulgaria and the Republic of Moldova from September 2020 until June 2023, Ms. Goulet served in a number of roles, including: Chargé d'Affaires for Armenia and Uzbekistan (2018-2019), Minister-counsellor (economic and trade) at the embassy in Moscow (2016-2020), Counsellor and senior trade commissioner at the embassy in Beijing (2012-2014), a posting at Canada's embassy in Tokyo (2003-2006) and a secondment to Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (2002-2003).

While in Ottawa, she was deputy director for Japan (2008-2009) and for nuclear policy (2009-2010) and director for non-proliferation and disarmament (2010-2011) and for commercial affairs with EU and European Free Trade Association countries (2014-2015) and she also held an assignment in the Privy Council Office's Foreign Policy and Defence Secretariat (2006-2007).

Ms. Goulet holds a BA Honours in Political Science and Modern Languages from McGill University (1992); a degree in Journalism from *École supérieure de journalisme de Paris* (1994) and an Executive Certificate in Public Leadership from Harvard Kennedy School of Government (2020).
