Coordination, collaboration and communication between the relevant stakeholders in the health and aviation sectors are essential to ensure the implementation of the World Health Organization (WHO) revised International Health Regulations (IHR); the ICAO public health related SARPs, the recommendations of the High-level Conference on COVID-19 (HLCC 2021) and the guidance of the ICAO Facilitation and CAPSCA (Collaborative Arrangement for the Prevention and Management of Public Health Events in Civil Aviation) programmes to achieve the objective of successfully managing public health-related matters in aviation.
