#### PREAMBLE

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# Annex 9: Facilitation (FAL)

*Facilitation is the efficient management of (customs, immigration, health and quarantine) **border control** processes, to expedite clearance (of **aircraft, passengers/crew, baggage and cargo**) and to prevent unnecessary delays*

- Maintain stability of supply chain
- Support economic growth
- Enable sustainable development of air transport
- Maintain security and flight safety

## **Annex 9 to the Chicago Convention**

- facilitation of landside formalities for clearance of aircraft, passengers, goods and mail
- requirements of customs, immigration, public health and agriculture authorities



## Annex 9 - Facilitation

- Includes many provisions on cargo, for instance:
  - Prioritizing live animals and perishable urgent goods
  - Prompt release of radioactive material/medical supplies.



## Annex 17: Security (AVSEC)

- Lead and support global efforts to establish sustainable civil aviation security regimes and oversight systems to:
  - prevent unlawful interference with civil aviation;
  - respond effectively to attacks and attempted attacks; and
  - assure the safe and efficient movement of people and goods

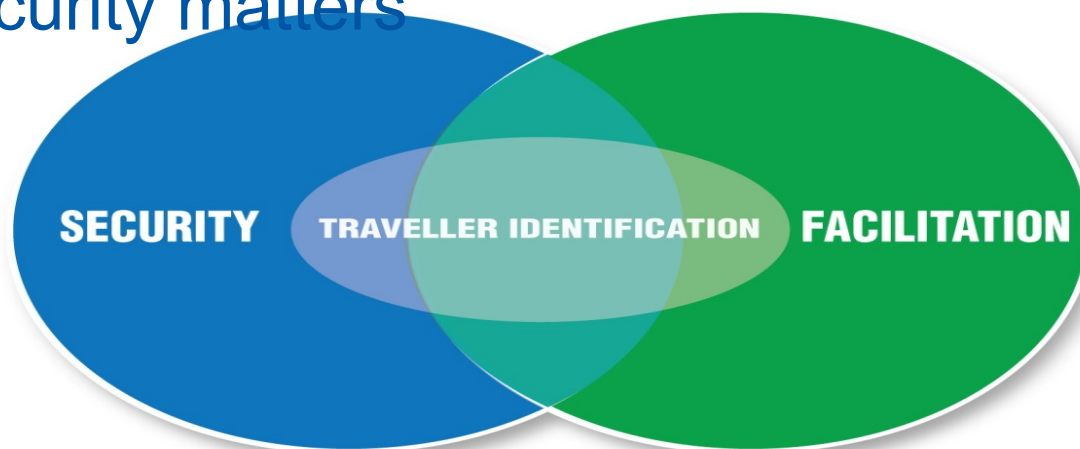

- APPENDIX A: General Policy
- The Assembly:
- Whereas a clear need exists for the strengthening of security to be applied to all phases and processes associated with the carriage of persons, their cabin and hold baggage, **cargo, mail, courier and express parcels**;
- Whereas threats to the air cargo and mail systems as a whole **require a global approach** in the development and implementation of security requirements and best practices, including cooperation with relevant international organizations such as the World Customs Organization (**WCO**), Universal Postal Union (**UPU**), and International Maritime Organization (**IMO**)



- **A38-15: Consolidated statement of continuing ICAO policies related to aviation security**
- 7. Encourages Member States, ..... , to promote the implementation of aviation security measures in a **practical manner** to
  - g) intensify efforts in securing the air cargo and mail security system by:
    - i. developing a strong, sustainable and resilient air cargo security framework;
    - iii. **adopting a total supply chain approach to air cargo and mail security;**

- The Assembly:
- 3. Requests the Council to ensure that Annex 9 — Facilitation, is current and addresses the contemporary requirements of Member States with respect to administration of border controls, cargo and passengers; advances in technologies related to such administration; cargo facilitation;
- 8. Urges Member States to call upon international operators and their associations to participate to the extent possible in electronic data interchange systems in order to achieve maximum efficiency levels in the processing of passenger and cargo traffic at international terminals;
- 10. Urges States and operators, in cooperation with interested international organizations, to make all possible efforts to speed up the handling and clearance of air cargo, while ensuring the security of the international supply chain; and
- 11. Urges Member States to undertake dialogue and cooperation between national and regional facilitation and security-related bodies



## Air Cargo Contribution to economic development

- More than **50 million tonnes** of freight and mail transported by air annually.
- More than **1/3 of the value of world trade** relies directly on air transport.
- Economies depend on air cargo.



# Air cargo security incidents

**29 October 2010**

- **Explosive devices** on two separate routings.
- Plot disrupted by intelligence, but revealed **vulnerabilities**.
- Immediate consequences : **delays and serious disruption of the supply chain**.



# Annex 17 - Security

- Amended three times since the October 2010 incidents (Amendments 12, 13 and 14)
- Amendments cover:
  - Common baseline standards for both passenger and all-cargo aircraft
  - Secure supply chain concept
  - Enhanced security for high-risk cargo
  - Requirements for screening





# ICAO response

**Urgent need to prevent disruption of connectivity and potential damage to global economy**

## **Steps taken to:**

- Identify interested parties and work **co-operatively** to address the issues.
- **Improve standards** of security for cargo and mail.
- Ensure that security requirements are practical, sustainable and **facilitate cargo movements.**

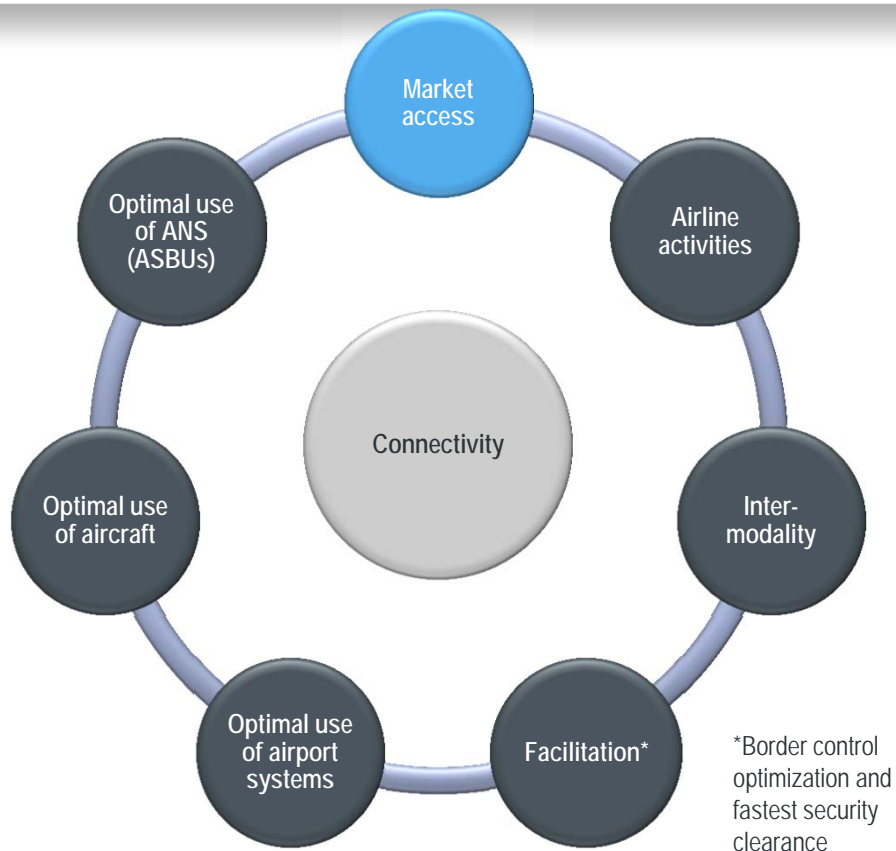


## Connectivity Components

- airline activities



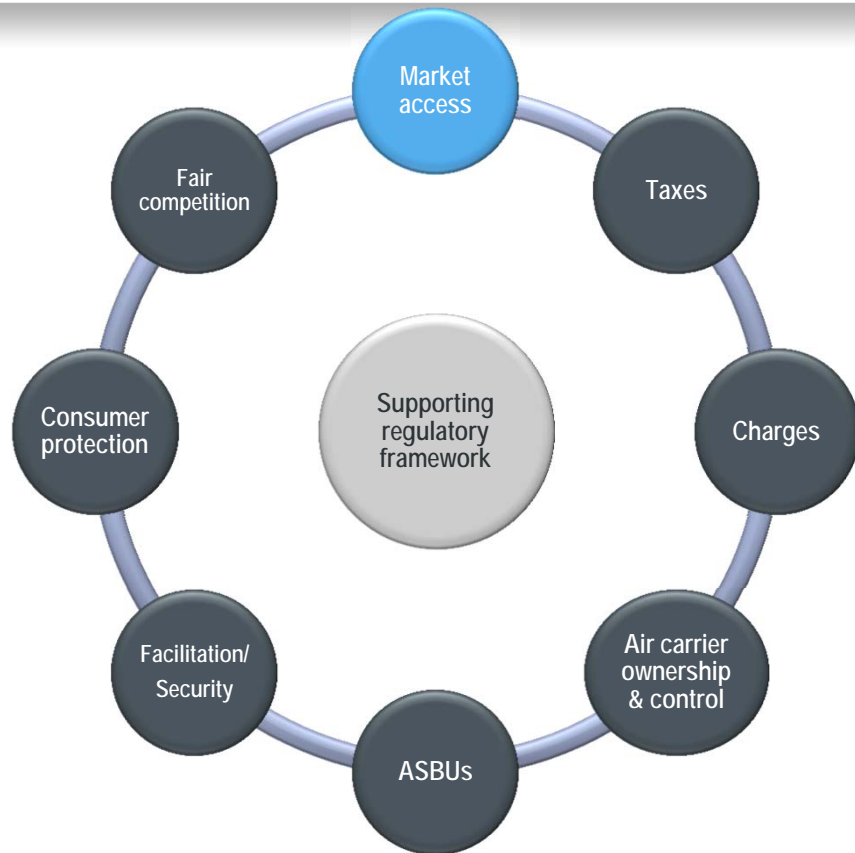

### ICAO AND TIACA TO STRENGTHEN COOPERATION

**Dallas/Fort Worth (18 April 2013):** The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and The International Air Cargo Association (TIACA) signed a Declaration of Intent today to strengthen co-operation on technical matters.

The declaration was officially signed in Dallas at TIACA's 2013 Executive Summit by the Association's Chairman, Michael Steen, and by ICAO's Secretary General, Raymond Benjamin.

Under the terms of the new agreement, ICAO and TIACA will work more closely on air cargo and mail security and facilitation, accelerating the evolution from paper-based to electronic processes, environmental stewardship, the liberalization of market access for air cargo services, and air cargo safety.



Michael Steen said: "This is another highly significant breakthrough in the new era of collaboration between our industry and leading regulatory bodies. ICAO is taking a lead in critical areas of aviation, such as security and the environment, and the Secretary General and his team have made a clear point of meeting with us, listening to our views and participating in our events to learn more about the requirements and concerns of the air cargo industry. ICAO clearly sees air cargo as the vital industry that it is and we welcome the opportunity to help this important global standards setter realize its objectives, based on a stronger understanding of the views of our sector."



On behalf of ICAO, Raymond Benjamin, added: "ICAO has been grateful for the input and advice received by TIACA as we have begun to develop closer ties with the air cargo sector. With this agreement now supporting our future cooperation across a wide range of shared priorities, ICAO will be focusing its near-term efforts on evolving our regulatory frameworks with States and industry stakeholders, including TIACA, toward the greater liberalization of air cargo services."

ICAO and TIACA have agreed to "consult, confer and cooperate on a continuous basis, over an above attendance at formal meetings. They will keep each other informed of project activities and programs of work in the areas identified in the Declaration of Intent.

TIACA, which is already on the list of international organizations that may be invited to attend ICAO meetings, has agreed to disseminate information on relevant ICAO standards and recommended practices, policies and technical guidance materials, and to promote implementation by its members.

Each of the parties will also invite the other to be represented by observers at global and regional conferences or meetings relating to the areas of cooperation.

This new commitment by ICAO and TIACA follows a joint communique for 'Enhanced Cooperation in the Field of Air Cargo Transportation' last October, which was issued at TIACA's 20th International Air Cargo Forum & Exposition in Atlanta, Georgia.
